COM-222 Communication for Health Care Professionals (3)

Introduces the theories and skills used to analyze and understand communication variables affecting human relationships, such as personal perception, feedback, idea development and nonverbal cues. Builds competencies and skills relevant to various interpersonal contexts within health care settings. Arts & Sciences Elective Code: B Hours per week: 3.0 lecture

COM-723 Workplace Communications (3)

Emphasizes practical application of theories and principles to develop writing skills essential to encounters in contexts of occupational communications. Includes writing business letters, resumes, memos, instructional materials and reports, and using visual aids, taught through a blend of formal lectures and student participation. Offered for students enrolled in Applied Science and Technology programs. Arts & Sciences Elective Code: B

Hours per week: 3.0 lecture

COM-924 Honors Project (1)

Allows a qualified honors student to pursue a special concentration of study under the guidance of a faculty member. Arts & Sciences Elective Code: A; Comments: Requires approval of supervising professor and dean *Hours per week*: 1.0 lecture

COM-928 Independent Study (1-3)

Allows the student to pursue a special concentration of study under the guidance of a faculty member. Requires an independent study contract. Arts & Sciences Elective Code: A; Comments: Requires approval of supervising professor and dean *Hours per week*: 2.0 lab
